
Your support and enthusiasm have been instrumental in this process, and we value your ongoing support as we take these vital steps forward.

Curriculum Highlights

Junior School



Year 1

A highlight from this term for Bal Gopal class was their project. They were engaged in the multiple processes of making papier-mâché which offered them the chance to develop awareness of Shapes and Structures; Building with papier-mâché helps children understand basic concepts of shapes, structures, and balance, which are foundational elements in both art and science.

Year 2

As part of their science inquiry, students in Krsna-Balaram class engaged in a project centered on "purposeful invention." Their goal was to develop inventions that addressed real-world challenges and offered practical benefits for themselves and their communities. Along with parents help and support, students created amazing inventions for Science Fair. We had inventions like, a teeth cleaning device, timetable gloves, water filter and many more!





Year 3

As part of their science inquiry have thoroughly enjoyed investigating science themes such as simple machines, magnets, forensic science, building and performing experiments. With the help of our outdoor teacher Ian prabhu we also performed experiments in our classroom such as the water clock and pendulum. Students then chose a topic of interest to investigate further and display for the science fair. It was wonderful to see their creative thinking and displays.

Year 4

Radha Giridhari class has been working hard on narrative text. First writing an opening to "hook" their audience, then describing the setting and characters and finally presenting the problem and resolution. They are also learning to re-craft their work by receiving feedback from their peers and proofreading their work before publishing and illustrating.

Year 5

The science theme for this term was inventions and innovations. The year 5's had a busy term going to MOTAT and having a facilitator take them through inventions and innovations over time. This helped lead up to our Science Fair, where we could create an invention or innovation. We also got to do many amazing experiments from learning Newton's law on gravitational pull to electric circuits to being a crime investigator! We were super excited to share "Why Narasimhadeva is important to us" by presenting it in a "live" News broadcast. Coming soon!






Year 6

This term, Jagannath class dived into the thought-provoking novel "Wonder" by R.J. Palacio. Through the journey of Auggie Pullman, a boy with facial differences attending school for the first time, our students explored themes of kindness, acceptance, and the importance of empathy. They delved into major themes like bullying, friendship, courage, and the power of kindness, relating them to real-life situations. Their exploration of "Wonder" has not only enriched their reading skills but also fostered a deeper sense of empathy and community within the classroom.

Year 7

Mayapur Class has written original Perspective Narratives this term featuring scenes from Canto 7 of the Bhagavatam. Creatively, students brought the plot to life while writing from a perspective of one of the characters in the lila they chose. Working tirelessly, they have employed various writing tools, such as sentence lengths, sentence structures and using newly learnt vocabulary. Enthusiastically, students learnt how to write cause/effect paragraphs and how to effectively edit ones work to create more impact.





Year 8

This term, our Year 8 students have been studying the novel, "Freak the Mighty". They have explored features of "quest" stories, the hero's journey, the legend of King Arthur and the genre of realistic fiction. Inspired by these ideas, the students have enjoyed writing their own "quest-style" narratives. They've been learning to use descriptive writing and have been working on editing and recrafting their work to produce a final product that they are proud of.

Senior School & learning areas



Years 9-10

This term, our students delved into the art of lino printing. They began by planning, designing, and drawing their unique ideas. These designs were then carefully cut into lino, which they inked to create beautiful prints. Their creativity didn't stop there; students also experimented with printing their designs on fabric. The lino printing project was a hit, with students thoroughly enjoying the entire process from conception to creation.

Yoga

This term in yoga, junior school students have been practising mindful listening and have mastered the sun salutation sequence. Meanwhile, middle school students have been honing their focus and learning about yoga principles and anatomy. The senior boys have dedicated themselves to core-strengthening yoga, always concluding with breath work, while the senior girls have been exploring the subtle aspects of yoga with great interest. Our hope is that, while learning yoga and experiencing its benefits physically and mentally, our students have a good amount of fun, forming a foundational love of yoga.



Outdoor Classroom

This term, the junior students had an enchanting experience exploring the forest. They participated in activities such as climbing rope courses, building shelters, and immersing themselves in nature. Some classes even got creative by making maps of the forest and inventing imaginary realms. Additionally, the students enjoyed planting a variety of vegetables including beans, potatoes, mint, and peas and relished the opportunity to taste the produce. Meanwhile, the seniors engaged in creative activities such as designing fabrics using tie-dye techniques and lino printing. An interesting aspect of the experience was that the students had the chance to create their own dyes using natural ingredients, providing a valuable learning experience. The metal forge continued to be a popular choice, allowing students to further develop their artistic and blacksmithing skills.

Physical Education

This term, for our juniors, we have had some professional Rippa Rugby players from North Harbour Rugby Union come to teach the sport weekly on a Friday and for the seniors, they have alternated between self defense/kickboxing classes and badminton/pickle ball also on the Friday.






















Life Education with Harold the Giraffe
